

SOP FOR CONDITIONAL MOVEMENT CONTROL ORDER IN MUKIM 12, BARAT DAYA DISTRICT, PENANG

Activities Allowed

- All Economic Activities and Industries
- Perform Government Official Duties
- Obtain Health Services/Emergency Matters/Death

Activities Not Allowed

- List of prohibited activities
- Outward Movement of residents from CMCO areas besides the activities that are allowed.
- Inward movement of residents from outside CMCO areas besides the activities that are allowed.

Affected Areas	Mukim 12, Barat Daya District, Pulau Pinang
Effective Period	6 th November 2020 (12.01 am) to 19 th November 2020 (11.59pm)
Movement Control	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Royal Malaysia Police (PDRM) is responsible for exercising control over infected local areas with the assistance of Malaysian Armed Forces (ATM), Malaysia Civil Defence Force (APM) and Malaysian Volunteer Corps Department (RELA). • Only two (2) persons are allowed in a single vehicle for the purpose of obtaining food / basic necessities, medical and other needs. High-risk adults and children are not encouraged to go to public areas, open and crowded. • Vehicles transporting essential goods and services, as well as economic / industrial activity chains are allowed to enter and exit. The number of passengers allowed in such vehicle depends on the commercial vehicle registration license • The movement of private / government departments / private companies' vehicles for the purpose of commuting to and from work or carrying out official Government duties depends on the seating capacity of the respective vehicle. • Activities and services at all airports and ports are allowed to operate. • For air movement through Penang International Airport (LTAPP), individuals need to obtain PDRM permission first. • Public transport services such as multi-stops bus, express bus and taxi / e-hailing services are allowed to operate. • Taxi / e-hailing services (maximum only 2 passengers) and food delivery services are allowed to operate from 6.00 am to 12.00 am throughout the CMCO period. • For emergency cases such as illness and funeral arrangements outside the mukim, these are allowed but are required to submit movement application to PDRM. The number of passengers depend on the emergency situations.

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Action	Brief Description
Activities in the CMCO Area	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Business / Economy / Industry can operate as prescribed by the Government. • Supermarkets, shopping malls and retail stores are allowed according to the SOPs. • Restaurants, shops / food stalls, food trucks, roadside hawkers, travelling hawkers, food courts / hawker centers, roadside food stalls / kiosks, grocery stores and convenience stores are allowed to operate between 6.00 am to 10.00 pm. • Purchase of food is encouraged to adopt drive-thru, food delivery or take-away only. Dine in is allowed with maximum of 2 customers per table, with physical social distance of one meter apart and compliance to the SOPs of the food sector. • Daily market operations are between 6.00 am to 2.00 pm only. • Wholesale market operations are between 12.00 am to 5.00 pm only. • Farmers market operations are between 6.00 am to 12.00 pm, with SOP compliance and the supervision of Malaysian Volunteer Corps Department (RELA) / local authority members. • Night market operations are allowed from 4pm to 10pm with SOP compliance and the supervision of Malaysian Volunteer Corps Department (RELA) / local authority members. • Petrol station operating hours are between 6.00 am to 10.00 pm. • Other business hours are between 6.00 am to 10.00 pm.

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Health and Medical Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Private and government clinics and hospitals, including veterinary clinics are allowed to operate 24 hours. • Pharmacies and medicinal shops can operate from 8am to 11pm • If you require medical and health services outside the CMCO area, PDRM permission must be obtained in advance except for those who already have a medical appointment card / letter.
Work-related Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Exit and enter movements across the CMCO area are not allowed. Only employees who have a valid employee pass OR a letter of permission from the employer are allowed for the purpose of working and performing duties. • Employers must comply with this order and assign employees to work from home EXCEPT employees that fall under the categories set by the JPA Circular for civil servants and Business Continuity Plan (BCP) (directly involved in company operations) for private sector employees. • Vehicles which transport employees are allowed to operate with the compliance of SOPs.

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Action	Brief Description
Sports & Recreational Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Contactless and individual sports, of not more than 10 people such as e-sports, walking, jogging, cycling, aerobic exercise, hiking, fishing and others that are done in an open space/area are allowed. • Hiking activities at all hiking locations at Mukim 12, Barat Daya, Penang are not allowed (excluding hiking areas under the Penang Forestry Department) • Activities at commercial football field, gymnasiums, futsal courts and commercial badminton halls are allowed with operating of between 6.00am to 10.00pm by following the Sports & Recreation Sectors SOPs. • Approval to operate and use the facilities of football and futsal fields by the public is limited to training activities that does not involved physical touching and for maximum of 10 persons only. All operators need to schedule and arrange the training session accordingly if there are more participants by limiting the numbers to not more than 10 persons at any time. • Centralised training programs that are organised by the National Sports Council and State Sports Council can continue with a Quarantine Based Approach.
Economic and Industrial Sector Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Economic and Industrial Sector Activities in CMCO areas may operate as usual with compliance to SOPs which have been established. • All vehicles related to business and manufacturing industries are allowed to operate, including cross-district/state travel
Fisheries, Plantation and Agriculture	Sectors related to Fisheries, Plantations, Agricultures, Livestocks and Food-Supply Chain can operate.

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List of Activities that are NOT ALLOWED (Negative List)	
Religious Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All religious activities in the mosque, prayer room, and non-Muslim religious sites are not allowed. Mosque and prayer rooms are only allowed to make the call to prayer, including the Imam to perform the daily prayers, with the number of participants as determined by the State Religious Authorities. • Management and workers at all non-Muslim religious houses are allowed for 6 persons only with compliance to the SOPs.
Entertainment activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Activities at night clubs and pubs, theme parks, indoor playgrounds and cinemas are not allowed. • Activities of musical recordings, concerts, filming, interviews and as such are allowed whether at studio recording or outdoors as long as social distancing is practised and without spectators, in compliance with the creative industry SOP
Seminars & Workshops, Conference, Exhibition	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All Seminars & Workshops, Conferences, Exhibition, Lectures, Training, Courses and activities related to Meetings, Incentives, Convention and Exhibitions (MICE) are not allowed. In service training can operate within the institutes only.
Meeting	<p>Government and private meetings involving the attendance of external agency representatives are not allowed and must be conducted virtually. Whereas internal meetings must follow the Public Office Department (JPA) Circular and MITI Guidelines.</p>
Organising Mass Events	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Official and non-official government and private ceremonies, social events, like wedding reception, wedding and engagement, and all Muslim related functions/special gatherings, birthday parties, reunions, anniversaries and other social events are not allowed. • Government/ private sector officers that require to exit CMCO areas to participate are not allowed

Education

- Government and Private Higher Learning Institutions, Vocational Schools, Normal Schools, Kindergartens, Nurseries, Childcare Centres, Religious Schools are closed during this period.
- Students from higher learning institutions who will be sitting for examinations with overseas institutes are allowed to take the exams but not participate in classes.

Sports and Recreational Activities

- Activities of picnics, swimming, physical touching, team tournaments and organisation of championships/tournaments are not allowed.
- Sports and recreation activities involving crowds and difficulty in maintaining social distancing are not allowed.
- Sports events and tournaments with attendance of spectators, and those involving participants from overseas are not allowed.

Other prohibited activities

- Any activities involving a large audience attending at a specified venue which makes it difficult for social-distancing and compliance with MOH's orders to take place are not allowed.
- Other matters that the government announces from time to time.
