

CONDITIONAL MOVEMENT CONTROL ORDER SOP FOR THE STATES OF KUALA LUMPUR, PUTRAJAYA, SELANGOR, KEDAH, PENANG, PERAK, NEGERI SEMBILAN, MALACCA, JOHOR & TERENGGANU

Activities Allowed

- All Economic Activities & Industries
- Perform Government Official Duties
- Obtain Health Services/Emergency Matters/Death

Activities Not Allowed

- List of prohibited activities
- Outward Movement of residents from CMCO areas / cross districts and cross states except with PDRM permission and activities that are allowed.
- Inward movement of residents from outside CMCO areas / cross districts and cross states except for activities that are allowed.

Standing Instructions

- Act 342
- Subject to the regulations issued by National Security Council and Ministry of Health
- Instructions, regulations and SOPs under the Ministry / Government Department / Government Agencies
- Other instructions from time to time issued by the Health Director General

Action	Brief Description
Affected Areas	Kuala Lumpur, Putrajaya, Selangor, Kedah, Penang, Perak, Negeri Sembilan, Malacca, Johor & Terengganu
Effective Period	9 th November 2020 (starting 12.01 am) to 6 th December 2020 (11.59pm)
Movement Control	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Royal Malaysia Police (PDRM) is responsible for exercising control over infected local areas with the assistance of Malaysian Armed Forces (ATM), Malaysia Civil Defence Force (APM) and Malaysian Volunteer Corps Department (RELA). • ONLY TWO (2) persons per household are allowed to go out (including in/on vehicle) for the purpose of purchasing / obtaining food supplies (including eating at restaurants / eateries / dine-in) or basic necessities and other needs. High-risk adults and children are not encouraged to go to public areas, both open and crowded. • Vehicles transporting essential goods and services, as well as economic / industrial activity chains are ALLOWED to enter and exit. The number of passengers allowed in such vehicle depends on the commercial vehicle registration license • The movement of private / government departments / private companies' vehicles for the purpose of commuting to and from work or carrying out official Government duties depends on the seating capacity of the respective vehicle. • Activities and services at all airports and ports are ALLOWED to operate. • For air movement through airports, individuals need to obtain PDRM permission first. • Public transport services such as multi-stops bus, express bus, LRT/ MRT/ ERL/ Monorail and taxi/ e-hailing services are ALLOWED to operate. Individuals who use public transports to cross-state / cross-district besides for work purposes are required to obtain PDRM permission. • Taxi / e-hailing services (maximum only 2 passengers) and food delivery services are ALLOWED to operate from 6.00 am to 12.00 am throughout the CMCO period.

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Movement Control	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • For emergency cases and accidents that require treatment at a nearby hospital / clinic are allowed to travel according to the capacity of the vehicle WITHOUT the need to obtain permission from PDRM. • Medical appointment cases are ALLOWED to travel according to the capacity of the vehicle by just showing the letter of appointment or appointment card. • Funeral management cases outside the CMCO area are allowed by obtaining permission from PDRM. The total number of passengers in the vehicle depends on the emergency situation. • Any individual who is originated from respective CMCO area is ALLOWED to return to the mentioned area by obtaining permission from PDRM. • Cases whereby an individual needs to pass by / cross through CMCO area to arrive at another area (destination) are ALLOWED by obtaining permission from a nearby police station before departure. The total number of passengers depends on the capacity of the vehicle. • Movements to EMCO area is based on the SOP of Enhanced Movement Control Order.

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Activities in the CMCO Area	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Businesses / Economic activities / Industries are ALLOWED to operate as prescribed by the Government. • Supermarkets, shopping malls and retail stores are ALLOWED to operate according to the SOPs from 6.00 am to 10.00pm. • Restaurants, food shops / stalls, food trucks, roadside hawkers, travelling hawkers, food courts / hawker centers, roadside food stalls / kiosks, grocery stores and convenience stores are ALLOWED to operate between 6.00 am to 10.00 pm. • Restaurant and food stores are ALLOWED to operate for dine-in (RESTRICTED to 2 - 4 customers per table, with social distancing of 1 meter among customers), take away, food delivery or drive-thru with the compliance to the SOPs of the food sector (Premised Businesses, Non-Premised Hawkers, Indoor Markets and Retail / Convenient Stores for F&B) • Daily market operations are between 6.00 am to 2.00 pm only with SOP compliance and supervision by the authorities. • Wholesale market operations are between 12.00 am to 5.00 pm only with SOP compliance and supervision by the authorities. • Farmers market operations are between 6.00 am to 12.00 pm, with SOP compliance and the supervision of Malaysian Volunteer Corps Department (RELA) / local authority members. • Night market operations are allowed from 4pm to 10pm with SOP compliance and the supervision of Malaysian Volunteer Corps Department (RELA) / local authority members. • Petrol station operating hours are between 6.00 am to 10.00 pm (except highway petrol stations which are allowed to operate 24 hours). • Laundry services are ALLOWED from 6.00am to 10.00pm. • Other business operations are ALLOWED from 6.00 am to 10.00 pm.

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Action	Brief Description
Health and Medical Services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Private and government clinics and hospitals are ALLOWED to operate 24 hours or according to the operational hours set by the government. • Pharmacies and medicinal shops can operate from 8am to 11pm.
Social Distancing (Physical)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Premise owners to control the crowd flow (enter and exit) within the premise by ensuring customers practice social-distancing of 1 metre apart at all time. • Premise owners to ensure that customers check-in the premise using MySejahtera or manually writing their names and contact number as well as scanning the body temperature. Body temperature of 37.5 degree Celsius and above is NOT ALLOWED to enter the premise. • Premise owners to limit the number of customers in the premise at one time and to display the maximum number of customers allowed in the premise.
Work-related Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Exit and enter movements across the CMCO area ARE NOT ALLOWED. Only employees who have a valid employee pass OR a letter of permission from the employer are ALLOWED for the purpose of working and performing duties. • Employers must comply with this order and assign employees to work from home EXCEPT employees that fall under the categories set by the Public Office Department (JPA) Circular for civil servants and Business Continuity Plan (BCP) (directly involved in company operations) for private sector employees. • Vehicles which transport employees including private vehicles are ALLOWED to operate with the compliance of SOPs.

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Action	Brief Description
Sports & Recreational Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Contactless and individual sports / recreational activities (indoor and outdoor), of not more than 10 people such as walking, jogging, cycling, aerobic exercise, hiking, fishing and others that are performed within the CMCO area only are ALLOWED with compliance to the SOPs of Sports & Recreation Sectors. • Activities at commercial football field, gymnasiums, futsal courts and commercial badminton halls (venues which have an actual premise) are ALLOWED to operate from 6.00am to 10.00pm with compliance to the SOPs of Sports & Recreation Sectors. • Approval to operate and use the facilities of commercial and futsal fields by the public is LIMITED to training activities that do not involve physical touching and for maximum of 10 persons only. All organisers and operators need to schedule the training if there are more participants by limiting the numbers to not more than 10 persons at any time. • Centralised training programs that are organised by the National Sports Council and respective State Sports Councils can continue with a “Quarantine Based Approach”, such as those that are conducted in MSN Complex in Bukit Jalil and Keramat, Badminton Academy Malaysia, Bukit Kiara, Paralympic Sports Center, Kg. Pandan and Velodrome, Nilai.

Economic and Industrial Sector Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Economic and Industrial Sector Activities in CMCO areas may operate as determined by the government with compliance to prescribed SOPs. • All vehicles related to industries, businesses and manufacturing sectors are ALLOWED to operate, including cross-district and cross-state.
Fisheries, Plantation and Agriculture	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sectors related to Fisheries, Plantation, Agriculture, Livestock and Food-Supply Chain are ALLOWED to operate.
Religious Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Activities in the mosques and surau are ALLOWED with restricted attendance as determined by the State Religious Authority. • Activities in non-Muslim houses of worship are ALLOWED with restricted attendance as determined by the NSC / MOH / State Government and the Ministry of Federal Territories for worship houses in the Federal Territories. • Islamic wedding ceremonies (akad nikah) are ALLOWED with the maximum presence of 30 people only based on the venue space / size and physical social distancing at the Religious office or subject to the total restricted number set by the State Religious Authority. • Non-Muslim wedding ceremonies are ALLOWED with the maximum presence of 30 people based on the venue space / size and physical social distancing at the National Registration Department / House of Worship / Non-Muslim Religious Association.

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Action	Brief Description
Creative Industries	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Video Shooting / Recording activities for music, concerts, filming, interviews and equivalent are ALLOWED either in-house recording (at a studio) or external premises RESTRICTED within CMCO areas only with a minimal crew number and WITHOUT AUDIENCES as well as with compliance to the Creative Industry SOPs. • Live events / activities without spectators are allowed with the restricted crew and staff number as set by the Ministry of Communications and Multimedia (KKMM). • Busking activities in closed / indoor locations (within buildings) are ALLOWED in accordance to the restrictions on performance timing and the restricted number of spectators as set by KKMM.
Other Activities that are Allowed	All other activities which are not included in the List of Prohibited Activities/Negative List are ALLOWED to operate based on the prescribed SOPs.

Entertainment activities

- Activities at night clubs and pubs, theme parks, indoor playgrounds and cinemas.
- Concerts or live events with spectators.

Seminars & Workshops, Conference, Exhibition

- All Seminars/ Workshops/ Conferences/ Exhibition/ Lectures/ Training/ Courses and activities related to Meetings, Incentives, Convention and Exhibitions (MICE).
- **EXCEPTIONS.** Ongoing training and related services **CAN BE CARRIED OUT** only within the institution training area only.

Meeting

- Government and private meetings involving the attendance of external agency representatives are not allowed and to be conducted virtually.
- **EXCEPTIONS.**
 - a) Face to face meetings **ARE ONLY ALLOWED** when the meetings involved expatriates and C-suites with physical social distancing and wearing face masks at all time throughout the meeting.
 - b) Internal meetings **ARE ALLOWED** in accordance with Public Office Department (JPA) Circulars / Orders and the MITI guidelines.

Organising Mass Events

- Official and non-official government and private ceremonies, social events, like ceremonies, wedding reception, wedding and engagement, and all Muslim related functions/special gatherings, birthday parties, reunions, anniversaries, retreats and other social events / gatherings.
- Participation of government and private officials for Official and Non-Official Events from CMCO and EMCO areas to other areas.

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List of Prohibited Activities	
Education	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Public and Private Higher Education Institutions, Vocational Training Centres, tahfiz centres, schools, kindergartens, nurseries, and day-care centres are closed during the CMCO period except for nurseries and day-care facilities for the children of frontliners and parents / guardians who are working with the permission to operate by the relevant Ministry. • EXCEPTIONS. School, IPTA, IPTS students sitting for examinations with foreign educational institutions are ALLOWED to be present solely to sit for the exams only and not for study / tutorial sessions.
Sports and Recreational Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Activities of picnics, swimming, physical touching, team tournaments and organisation of championships / tournaments • Sports and recreation activities involving crowds and difficulty in maintaining physical social distancing. • Sports events and tournaments with attendance of spectators, and those involving participants from overseas.
Tourism Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • All tourism activities which require to leave the CMCO area and entering the CMCO area. • Cross-state tourism activities by citizens and domestic tourism involving foreign tourists entering Malaysia except for qualified foreign tourists as determined by the Minister.
Other Prohibited Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Any activities involving a large audience attending at a specified venue which makes it difficult for physical social-distancing and compliance with MOH's orders to take place • Other matters as announced by the government from time to time.
